Full-time Workload: PUC has no set full-time course load requirements. In general, full-time students take 4

courses but most Exchange Students take between 3-4 courses. Undergraduate courses run

20 weeks.

MBA courses run 13 weeks.

Each Course at the MBA has 33 contact hours.

Learning Expectations:

Class format is a combination of lectures and in-class presentations, group projects and case studies. Low attendance will result in lower grades. Active class participation is usually part of each student's final grade. Grading is based on papers, case studies, and group projects. Exam format varies. The final exams take place at the end of each term and are obligatory. Class sizes are from 20-60 students for undergraduate programs. Classes are smaller for MBA students.
