

# **Getting Involved**





#### How can you get involved?

#### **Apply for a position**

- » Includes board and committee positions
- » Applications entail:
  - 1. Written App through the Centralized Application
  - 2. Up to 2 rounds of interviews

#### General Body Member Engagement

- Members are able to learn about clubs and and acquire acquire hands-on experience with various topics/industries,
- » A great way to learn more about the club ecosystem





### **GBM Programs**

#### **Overview**

- » No applications required -> sign ups are still through the Centralized Application
- » Offers meaningful opportunities to get involved
- » Can explore the club ecosystem to identify the right club(s) for you and get to know them inside out

#### **Sample Programs**

- » Weekly seminars for investment education and pitch workshops
  - Series of weekly speaker, social, and mentorship events

### **Application Process**

#### **Clubbing Fair**

- » Use the Club Booklet as your main Guide!
- » Talk to as many clubs as may interest you
- » Don't be afraid to look around!

## **Centralized Application System**

- The written component of your application
- » A series of questions not exceeding 500 words total
- » 2 weeks to complete


#### **Interviews**

- » 1 or 2 rounds depending on the club
- » Some a behavioral other are more practical/ case based.
- If you have a case interviewreach out to ask for a guide

### **Central Application**

#### What?


All Wharton Council Recognized Clubs have their applications only there.

- Hosted on Penn Clubs.
- Will save your latest submission
- 3. Not a rolling deadline

#### Why?

Use it to browse through clubs, see what the open spots are, and whether they interest you - all in one spot!!!

# **Policies and You**







## Recruitment policies that you should know

- The written app will have a 500 word limit per committee with 2 committee max per club
- 2. Clubs must only accept applications through the **centralized platform**.
- Clubs will be prohibited from requesting resumes. A list of past activities is permitted.
- 4. Clubs will be allowed a **maximum of two rounds of interviews** per applicant during the
  recruitment process

- 5. Clubs may not ask questions related to a candidate's network (i.e. if they know anyone in the organization, industry, or otherwise)
- 6. Brainteasers will be prohibited.
- 7. There will be **no group case interviews**
- 8. If a candidate is not accepted, they **must be notified**
