What you can do to keep our water clean!

- Pick up any litter or garbage you see. Remember to always put trash and recycling in the correct containers
- Never dispose of oil or other engine fluids down the storm drain, on the ground, or into a ditch



- Only buy what you need. Store and dispose of chemicals properly
- Read the label and directions;
 never dump hazardous



- Bag pet waste while on walks and dispose of it once you are home or in a designated pet waste station
- Pet waste in your yards should also be picked up every day and disposed of in a solid waste bin



Avoid pesticides; learn about Integrated Pest Management (IPM), carefully apply fertilizers, pesticides, or herbicides on your lawn or garden, and **always** follow the directions



- Check cars for leaks, recycle motor oil, and promptly repair oil, antifreeze, and transmission fluid leaks
- Until repairs are completed,



- Keep storm drains clear of yard waste and clippings (grass, leaves and sticks)
- Direct gutters away from paved

products down storm drains, sinks, or on the ground
