Director of Organizational Affairs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oversee the student organization recognition and renewal processes, includes assisting students seeking to develop a new student organizations. • Develop and update rules regarding student organization conduct and investigate reports on student organization misconduct as part of the student organization conduct process. • Assist in the development of training sessions for new student organization leaders at the beginning of each fall semester. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be enrolled as a student at UW-Stout on a segregated fee-paying basis for the next two semesters. • Be in good academic standing (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) • Receives \$2,500 per semester in the form of a scholarship
Director of Financial Affairs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oversee the allocation of the Student Activity Fee, which provides \$400,000+ funding annually to student organizations. • Ensure student organization spending is in alignment with state law, university policy, and Stout Student Association rules. • Assist in the development of training sessions for student organization treasurers and spenders. 	
Director of Legislative Affairs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Chairs the Congressional Committee and leads discussion on legislation and policy developments on the local, state, and federal level that affect students. • Serve as the primary coordinator of campus voter engagement efforts, includes scheduling voter registration events, providing resources to students, and more. • Informs the University Student Senate and the student body at-large on legislation and policy developments on the local, state, and federal level. 	
Director of Sustainability	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Chair the Sustainability Council, a standing committee that discusses and raises awareness of Sustainability on campus. • Oversee allocation of the Green Fee, a fund dedicated towards the funding of environmentally sustainable projects. • Provide recommendations to the University Student Senate on policies and legislation concerning environmental sustainability. 	
Director of Information Technology	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Chairs the Student Technology Committee which discusses/implements technology-related initiatives that affect the campus and students. • Oversees allocation of the Student Technology Fee, a fund dedicated towards the funding of technology-related projects and innovation on campus. • Provides recommendations to the University Student Senate on policies and legislation concerning data privacy and information technology 	
Director of Academic Affairs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Chairs the Academic Affairs Committee and leads discussion on academic policies and initiatives. • Coordinates and organizes student feedback on academic policy changes. • Meet with Faculty and UW-Stout administration as the primary student voice on Academic issues. 	
Vice President	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Serve as the primary voice of the student body in meetings with leaders internal and external to the University. • Oversee operations of the University Student Senate, its members, and its subcommittees. • Assert the rights of students under state law, system, and university policies. • Ensure that the voices of students are represented in campus decision-making 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be enrolled as a student at UW-Stout on a segregated fee-paying basis for the fall and spring semester. • Be in good academic standing (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) • Receives \$3,000/\$2,750 per semester in the form of a scholarship.
