- 1. Approval of September Minutes
  - a. Minutes Approved
- 2. Invited Speakers Office of the Graduate Biomedical Education (OGBE)
  - a. Their offices can be found in the 1830 Monument Building in Suite 613
  - b. Dr. Peter Espenchade discussed his role in OGBE. The office is designed to help support Graduate Students during their time of learning at JHU. Similar to many JHU faculty, Dr. Espenshade serves in both an academic role, as a researcher studying Pancreatic Cancer metabolism, and as an administrator as the Associate Dean of Graduate Biomedical Education. In this role, he works with individual programs to ensure that JHU if offering the best education to its students. He reports to the Vice Dean for Education, Roy Zeiglestein, who oversees SOM students. As such, his office hosts monthly committee meetings (MA/PHD Committee) where he discusses with program directors areas of improvment, institution of pilot programs, and votes to make changes to programs policies, but he does not provide funding for programs. Lastly, he is also involved in developing retreats for programs to discuss innovated topics, and he currently liases with the Union TRU-UE\*. \*Please note he is not able to openly discuss communication about Union meetings with general student body.
  - c. Dr. Andrea Young is the Assistant Dean for Graduate Biomedical Education and Graduate Student Diversity. She serves as faculty in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Science and her research focues on understanding how disparities to pychiatric access affect outcomes. In her role in OGBE, she does a lot of work in the area of graduate student recruitment, attends graduate conferences (i.e. SACNES and ABRCMS), and graduate school fairs. In addition, she facilitates the Graduate Student Emergecy Relif Fund (GSEF) that was implemented last year to help students with one-time payment for financial emergencies. In addition she is spearheading a new workshop series for students "The Wellness Seminar Series" which will cover topics that graduate stduents struggle with such as imposter syndrom, mindfullness and meditation, time management, healthy relationships, nutrition, etc. She is open for additional topics. Check your emails for more information! Lastly, she serves as the liasaon for affinity group son campus and works with the DEI office.
  - d. **Kristina Nance** is the Assistant Director for Graduate Student Experience & Diversity. She has worked in Student Affairs for 20 years. Her role simplified....helping students exist in graduate school! Similar to Dr. Young, Mrs. Nance helps with student recruitment by attending grduate career fairs and conferences. In addition she helps work on the Pathway and Prep Summer Internship Programs of which she is recuriting mentor volunteers, so if you are interested in this please send ger an email. Lastly, she helps manage the OGBE Laptop Loaner Program, if a students laptop is broken, or the students are awaiting a new one, they cab apply for a 2 month loaner laptop (5PC and 2 Mac available).
  - e. **Dr. Katie Labor** is our Graduate Student Life/Experiance Coordinator. She is involved in a lot of little things that help support student life here at Hopkins. If you think it she is involved. This includes things like managing GSA's subsidized parking, helping with the summer internship programs, and she is the one who manages student group reimbursment as well. She helped GSA with identifying a private space on campus, and so many other tasks.     - A working group has been formed spearheaded by Dr. Landon King, the Executive Vice Dean for the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. Within this working group are representatives from SOM Graduate Stduents (GSA), BSPH Graduate Stduents (BSPHSA), SOM Medical Stddent (MSS), SON Stddents (NSS), Post Docs (PDA), Medical Fellows, Johns Hopkins Staff, etc.
    - In their initial email, we were informed that the Cooley Center (and adjacent builings such as Hampton House) would be torn down to make room for the New Life Science Building.
       Hopkins did not wish to build on new purchased land, as Hopkins wishes not to take more land from Baltimore Residents.
