2. Invited Speakers

Dr. Sabine Stanley serves as the Vice Provost for Graduate Education, overseeing all aspects of graduate education at the university. Her responsibilities include managing standing committees, initiatives, and assisting with special situations. This involves leading the Doctor of Philosophy Board, comprised of faculty and PhD students, which conducts comprehensive reviews of PhD programs. She also oversees the CISAC (Cross Institutional Student Advisory Committee), ensuring representation from all student governance groups across the university. Additionally, Dr. Stanley is involved in the PhD advisory committee, a group of PhD students from various programs, providing advice on policies and initiatives before finalization. She plays a key role in the University bargaining team, collaborating with the student union to develop bargaining agreements.

Dr. Stanley leads various initiatives for multiple schools, such as Pathways to PhD, Vivian Thomas, Doctoral Relocation Grants Program, and the Graduate Honors Program. She conducts surveys, including the enrolled graduate student survey every two years and the PhD Exit Survey. Dr. Stanley is also involved in the mentorship agreement policy and oversees an Ombuds resource, allowing students to seek confidential advice for conflicts, with the option to escalate issues to her if needed.

Rachelle Hernandez, the Vice Provost for Student Affairs, oversees all aspects of student policy and procedures for the university. She serves as a go-to person for issue resolution, coordinating with student affairs members in schools and academic affairs to ensure students' needs are met. Hernandez works on cross-university initiatives and is responsible for adding a new support system to provide necessary information. She is currently involved in initiatives such as Enabled Mobile Credentials, allowing all schools to access resources like the new Bloomberg Center in Washington, DC. Hernandez is also working on the development of a Hopkins Student Center, a university-wide center on the Homewood campus, set to open in the summer of 2025. This center, similar to a union center, will be available for all students and alumni.

Hernandez oversees a food pantry on the Homewood campus and is working to expand it to East Baltimore. She is actively engaged in the Cross Institutional Student Advisory Committee, launched last spring, which serves as a platform for students to discuss common concerns. Hernandez is part of Kevin Shollenberger's team, the Provost of Health and Wellbeing, working to ensure student access to clinics on various Hopkins campuses. This team is also developing new university-wide policies, including those related to leave of absence, to meet the consistent needs of students across all campuses. Additionally, they address reports on issues related to student conduct.

- i. Cooley Center Updates
 - A working group has been formed spearheaded by Dr. Landon King, the Executive Vice Dean for the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. Within this working group are representatives from SOM Graduate Students (GSA), BSPH Graduate Students (BSPHSA), SOM Medical Student (MSS), SON Students (NSS), Post Docs (PDA), Medical Fellows, Johns Hopkins Staff, etc.

 Residents.
